2010 HISTORY DAY COMPETITION AWARDS

AWARDS FOR DISPLAY/POSTER, COMPUTER PROJECT, HISTORY EXAM, AND RESEARCH PAPER COMPETITIONS

For 2010 Graduating Seniors

First, second and third place winners will be awarded a tuition scholarship to be used in the 2009-2010 academic year's intersessions or summer terms at the University of Mississippi in each of these competitions. The tuition scholarships are as follows:

- First place – a 6 credit-hour tuition scholarship
- Second place – a 3 credit-hour tuition scholarship
- Third place – a 3 credit-hour tuition scholarship

In addition to first, second and third place winners in the overall scores for the History Exam, each top subject score will be awarded a 3 credit-hour tuition scholarship.

These tuition scholarships may be used for any intersession or summer term tuition charges, and will include, if applicable, non-resident fees. These tuition scholarships cannot be used for the fall or spring semesters' charges. Receiving a scholarship does not guarantee admission to the university. The student must meet all admission requirements. A competitor may not win more than 6 credit hours worth of tuition scholarships for History Day 2008. Currently, a 3-credit hour tuition scholarship is worth \$575.25. All federal, state and institutional financial aid rules will apply.

For Juniors, Sophomores and Freshmen

First, second and third place winners will be awarded a scholarship for the Summer Academy (Jr. High Students) or for the Summer College (Sr. High Students) in each of these competitions. The scholarships are as follows:

- First place – a full scholarship for tuition AND housing
- Second place – a full scholarship for tuition and a **half** scholarship for housing
- Third place – a full scholarship for tuition only

In addition to first, second and third place winners in the overall scores for the History Exam, each top subject score will be awarded a full scholarship for tuition only.

Scholarships may be applied only toward expenses for the Summer Academy or the Summer College. Receiving a scholarship does not guarantee admission to a particular program. The student must meet all admission requirements. A competitor may not win more than a full scholarship for tuition and housing by winning multiple events at History Day 2010. All federal, state and institutional financial aid rules will apply.

AWARDS FOR VIDEO PRESENTATIONS AND TEAM HISTORY BOWL COMPETITIONS

Certificates will be awarded to first, second and third place winners in these competitions.
